What is the World's Best Workforce?

The World's Best Workforce (WBWF) was developed in 2013 (<u>Minnesota Statutes</u>, <u>section 120B.11</u>) to ensure that school districts and charter schools in Minnesota enhance student achievement through teaching and learning support. School boards that govern districts and charter schools are required to develop comprehensive, long-term strategic plans that address the following five WBWF goals:

- All children are ready for school.
- All third-graders can read at grade level.
- All racial and economic achievement gaps between students are closed.
- All students are ready for career and college.
- All students graduate from high school.

How does Spero use WBWF?

- Spero Academy aligns the World's Best Workforce Strategic plan with Spero Academy's Board of Directors 5 year Strategic Plan. (Spero Academy's current strategic plan time frame-2019-2024)

How Spero Uses Personalized Learning Plans (PLPs):

At the core, a Personalized Learning Plan is a measurable long-term academic growth target — one that is set by the teacher at the beginning of the year. The principal areas we observe are literacy, mathematics, social and emotional growth. By discovering a baseline for each student we are able to assess areas that can be improved. These areas directly reflect a students areas of greatest need in order to foster the very best route to success.

What Informs Personalized Learning Plans (PLPs)?

Teachers at Spero perform district assessments at least twice per year, once in the fall and once in the spring.

Our Literacy district/ State assessments include:

- NWEA (Northwest Evaluation Association), also called MAP (Measures of Academic Progress)
- The Whole to Part
- Spero Academy Emergent Literacy Assessment
- Spero Academy Developmental Literacy Inventory
- Minnesota Comprehensive Assessment (MCA)
- Minnesota Test of Academic Skills (MTAS)

Our math district assessments include:

- NWEA (Northwest Evaluation Association), also called MAP (Measures of Academic Progress)
- Spero Academy Mathematics Inventory
- Spero Academy Developmental Mathematics Inventory

Social and Emotional Checklists:

Teachers at Spero perform skills checklists throughout the school year. Students who qualify for social, emotional, regulation, or behavior services through the IEP process are assessed on their social and emotional skills during evaluations, IEPs, and during progress reporting. These skills checklists are widely used by our staff and therapists to determine classroom supports that are needed. Teachers and therapists determine which skills assessments best meet the needs of their classroom and students.

WBWF Goal Area 1: All Students Ready for School

This first goal addresses our incoming Kindergarten students and their preparedness for learning in the school environment. One of the biggest factors in whether a student is ready for school is their emergent literacy development. The WBWF advisory committee would like to prioritize our kindergarten students' literacy skills in order to ensure they are school-ready.

WBWF Goal Area 2: All Students in Third Grade Achieving Grade-Level Literacy

This second goal addresses our third grade students' literacy achievement. Third grade is a pivotal point in a child's literacy development. According to the MN Common Core State Standards, students should be fluent readers by third grade in order to access grade level standards. This is commonly known as the point when students stop learning to read and begin reading to learn. Since Spero Academy serves a unique population of students with diverse learning needs, we adapt and modify the standards to meet students where they are at within their literacy development. Therefore, our goal takes a more individualized approach

WBWF Goal Area 3: Close the Achievement Gap Between Students

It is not possible to compare growth in proficiency between students with disabilities and students without disabilities, given Spero Academy's enrollment. Therefore we examined the achievement gap between our students who have more profound educational delays who are eligible to take the MTAS and those students with less significant educational delays who take the MCAs.

WBWF Goal Area 4: All Students College and Career Ready by Graduation

All students are assessed for social/emotional/behavioral (SEB) skills using a variety of SEL skills checklists including autism checklist, developmental checklists, and skills inventories. Based on these results, teachers, parents, and support staff identify a PLP goal for SEB skills. This goal is then supported with classroom interventions and support, with assistance from therapists and classroom staff.
